Amy & Brian import their juice from Thailand, so its exotic flavor comes straight from the coconut, as if you'd simply hacked off the top and inserted a straw. Though we prefer to drink it in a glass, where we can keep an eye on the action. Little white pieces of coconut fruit, or pulp, suspend themselves in the water. It's like a summer snow globe, only delicious.

We liked the lemon-honey aroma, and, as we swallowed the juice, enjoyed chewing on the tender pulp left behind. You'll think you've washed up at a steamy beach resort with an icy thirst-quencher in hand. Or try this: Freeze Amy & Brian's pulp-free version into cubes, and let them melt into your next daiquiri.
